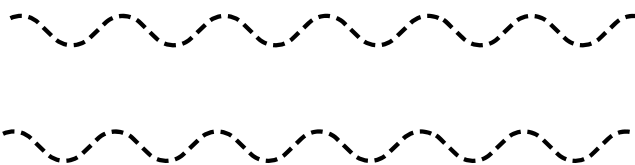




Empowering Communities from the Ground Up: New NGO Initiative Targets Health, Education, and Livelihood Gaps

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The Program Aims to Bridge Policy and People by Addressing Healthcare, Livelihood, and Education Gaps in Underserved Regions
